

Report of the Webinar

The webinar *Natok: Bhashye o Drishye* was organized by the Department of Bengali, Naba Ballygunge Mahavidyalaya. The webinar began with a brief welcome address by the Principal, Naba Ballygunge Mahavidyalaya. Dr Sumit Kumar Debnath gave brief overview of the invited resource persons of the day. Professor Pabitra Sarkar gave a detailed delineation of drama as we read it and drama as we watch it on stage. He said that the two resource persons of the day are going to discuss and interact with the audience on the various connections related to the difference of drama as a text and drama as performance.

Shri Soumitra Basu talked about the stage as a site of performance and how the props, decoration, light, sound, make up of the artistes, hair decoration of the dramatis personae and other paraphernalia on stage and off stage play a huge role in the formation of drama. He added that 13 components of theatre connect themselves with the audience. Shri Goutam Halder, veteran theatrician has given an extensive lecture on the quintessential poses, dialogue delivery, soliloquys, that a single actor performs on stage. Taking recourse in *Meghnadbadh Kabya*, Shri Halder in his typical theatrics succinctly brought out the nuances of single-actor play.
